At the Christian Church, we practice the principle of the ministry of all believers, for God's Spirit indwells and gifts each one. We encourage, train, and support every member to be faithful followers and servants of Jesus Christ. As a result, we believe you will find a fresh and vital kind of Christian faith here.
